32nd Annual Regis Auction Themed “Run for the Roses”

Event slated for October 15

Stayton, Ore. 25 Aug. 2011 – The 32nd annual Regis Green and Gold auction and raffle will be held Saturday, October 15, 2011 at 5 p.m. at Regis High School in Stayton, Ore. and will be themed the “Run for the Roses.” At this long-standing event, people come together to raise money for Regis High School’s operating fund. Known as “one of the biggest social events of the year in this area,” the auction generates about 10 percent of the school’s revenue annually, averaging about \$1,000 to \$1,100 per student.

This year’s raffle car is a 2012 Chevrolet Cruze 1LT with an MSRP of \$21,600. “A new twist this year is that we have three prizes to give away,” says Gay Frank, Regis Special Events and Auction Coordinator. “The car is the first place prize, second place wins a Traeger Texas Barbecue, and third place wins an iPad 2!”

As a new way to promote the event this year, owner of Foo Foo Purses and Accessories Tami Brentano is sponsoring “Kentucky Derby Hat Week” September 19-23. Ladies interested in wearing a hat to the auction may go to Tami’s house and create their own hat.
