Parents and prospective students will get the chance to learn about the increasing tuition assistance options and to meet teachers, coaches and current students.

One of the most attractive aspects of being a Regis student is the opportunity to be involved in the school’s ASPIRE program, Oregon’s mentoring program to help students access education and training beyond high school. ASPIRE volunteers help students plan for education, careers, and training beyond high school. Specifically, they help students navigate financial aid options and procedures, apply for scholarships and college admission as well as engage students in work/learning experiences to enhance career preparation. Families will be able to learn about ASPIRE and meet those involved at the open house.
